2010 Offering of Letters

Bread for the World has a long history of working to expand nutrition programs, our country's safety net for vulnerable people. These are critical services that keep people from going hungry. But nutrition programs alone are not enough to help families overcome hunger. Low-income families also need broader measures to reduce poverty and help them build financial stability.

Current tax credits for low-income workers were designed so that people who work would have enough financial resources to meet their basic needs, including food. But that's not happening anymore. These programs are falling short of their intent. The result: Millions of working families are struggling to put food on the table.

In 2010, tax policies will be debated as previous tax cuts enacted earlier this decade are due to expire. Congress will decide which ones to renew or change.

The president and others have said it should be our nation's goal to end childhood hunger in the United States by 2015. Achieving this goal would require not only a stronger nutrition program but also long-term measures to reduce poverty such as tax credits for low-income families.

Bread for the World's 2010 Offering of Letters will push for changes in the U.S. tax code that will benefit low-income families and help them lift themselves and their children out of hunger and poverty.

Directions

From the Garden State Parkway (North or South): Take Exit 145 to Route 280 East. Move into far left lane and exit at First Street / Newark. At light, turn left onto First Street. At next light, turn right onto Orange Street. After two lights, turn left onto Clifton Avenue. Take Clifton Avenue past Sacred Heart Cathedral. The Archdiocesan Center is on the corner of Clifton and Park Avenues, diagonally across from Sacred Heart Cathedral. *Parking lot is on the right just before the Archdiocesan Center.

From the New Jersey Turnpike (North or South): Take Exit 15W – Route 280 West. Take Route 280 West to the Clifton Avenue (Exit 14). At the traffic light, turn right on to Clifton Avenue. Pass Sacred Heart Cathedral on your left. The Archdiocesan Center is on your right just before Park Avenue. *

From Route 21: Route 21 North turn left onto Third Ave. (Newark) Route 21 South turn right onto Third Ave. (Newark) Proceed straight to Clifton Avenue and turn left. Archdiocesan Center is on the left side of the street.

Public Transportation: Take PATH to Newark. Take the City Subway to Park Avenue. Walk approximately 7 blocks to Clifton Avenue.

Access to Parking Lot is from Clifton Avenue. On-site security parking is provided. The Archdiocesan Center is handicapped accessible.
