CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I.

NAME OF THE SOCIETY.

This society shall be known by the name of "Chikbita Ahawai Sholom."

ARTICLE II.

OBJECT OF THE SOCIETY.

The object of this society shall be to keep divine services on every Subbath and Holiday; to assist the sick and needy and perform all deties to a deceased member and his family as may be designated in the By-Laws hereafter.

ARTICLE III.

LANGUAGE,

The proceedings and books of the society shall be kept in the English language.

ARTICLE IV.

OFFICERS AND THEIR ELECTIONS.

Section 1. The officers of this society shall consist of a President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, four Trustees, a Visiting Sick Committee and Messenger. They shall be elected annually by the members of the society.

Sec. 2. The nomination and election shall take place at the meeting in October and the installation in November.

Sec. 3. All condidates for office must be members in good standing, whose membership shall have been at least three months in the society, and must be able to read and write the English language.










The Office of the Secretary provides administrative services and tools for ELCA leaders who are serving this church in their **Churchwide Organization** congregations, synods and the churchwide organization, especially those given responsibility for governance of the ELCA. Office of the Presiding Bishop The secretary interprets the constitutions and other governing documents of this church and is responsible for maintaining its Office of the Secretary rosters, the ELCA archives, and the minutes and records of certain meetings. The Office of the Secretary receives the annual Constitutions report of the congregations, provides travel and physical arrangements for meetings of the churchwide organization Congregations information for the online ELCA Directory, staffs the nominating processes of this church and coordinates the use of legal **Synods** counsel. **Rostered Ministers** Deacon Sue E. Rothmeyer was elected to serve a six-year term as ELCA secretary by the 2019 Churchwide Assembly in Legal Issues Milwaukee. Previously, Secretary Rothmeyer served as assistant to the secretary and executive for Office of the Secretary Risk Management, Loss administration from 2012 to 2019. She has worked for the churchwide organization in Chicago in various roles, including youth Prevention and Insurance and young adult and campus ministry, since 1995. 2025 CHURCHWIDE ASSEMBLY AMENDMENTS TO THE MODEL CONSTITUTION FOR CONGREGATIONS OF THE EVANGELICAL LUTHERAN CHURCH IN AMERICA®

[WITH RATIONALES]

Prepared by the Office of the Secretary Evangelical Lutheran Church in America August 2025

Following are amendments to the *Model Constitution for Congregations* that were approved by the 2025 Churchwide Assembly. Additions are <u>underlined</u>; deletions are struck through; all changes are <u>highlighted</u>.

Provisions within the *Model Constitution for Congregations* are of two types:

- Those provisions marked with an asterisk (*) are required when a congregation amends its governing documents. They must be used without alteration or amendment of the text in any manner (i.e., neither additions nor deletions are permissible). Such provisions go into effect immediately upon approval by a majority vote of those voting members present and voting at any legally called meeting of the congregation, provided that they have been presented to the congregation at least 30 days prior to the meeting.
- Provisions not marked with an asterisk are non-required provisions. These provisions represent wording recommended by the Churchwide Assembly. If the congregation chooses to incorporate them into the congregation's constitution exactly as presented here, these provisions require a majority vote of those voting members present and voting at any legally called meeting of the congregation, provided that they have been presented to the congregation at least 30 days prior to the meeting.

If the wording of non-required provisions is altered or amended in any way from the text presented

Chapter 1.

Chapter 2. CONFESSION OF FAITH

- *C2.01. This congregation confesses the Triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
- *C2.02. This congregation confesses Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior and the Gospel as the power of God for the salvation of all who believe.
 - Jesus Christ is the Word of God incarnate, through whom everything was made and through whose life, death, and resurrection God fashions a new creation.

Recommended Provisions

These are recommended by the ELCA but NOT required

*C5.04.

This congregation shall elect from among its voting members laypersons to serve as voting members of the Synod Assembly as well as persons to represent it at meetings of any conference, cluster, coalition, or other area subdivision of which it is a member. The number of persons to be elected by this congregation and other qualifications shall be as prescribed in guidelines established by the *(insert name of synod)* of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.




This congregation shall have a mission endowment fund that will operate as specified in this congregation's [bylaws] [continuing resolutions]. The purpose of the mission endowment fund is to provide for mission work beyond the operational budget of this congregation.

Local Congregation Decisions

*C8.02.

In some cases a decision from among several options MUST be made by the local congregation

Choose ONE



Members shall be classified as follows:

- a. **Baptized** members are those persons who have been received by the Sacrament of Holy Baptism in this congregation, or, having been previously baptized in the name of the Triune God, have been received by certificate of transfer from other Lutheran congregations or by affirmation of feith
- b. *Confirmed* members are baptized persons who have been confirmed in this congregation, those who have been received by adult baptism or by transfer as confirmed members from other Lutheran congregations, or baptized persons received by affirmation of faith.
- c. Voting members are confirmed members. Such confirmed members, during the current or preceding calendar year, shall have communed in this congregation and shall have made a contribution of record to this congregation. Members of this congregation who have satisfied these basic standards shall have the privilege of voice and vote at every regular and special meeting of this congregation as well as the other rights and privileges ascribed to voting members by the provisions of this constitution and its bylaws. They shall not have voted as a seasonal member of another congregation of this church in the previous two calendar months.
- d. *Associate* members are persons holding membership in other [ELCA] [Lutheran] [Christian] congregations who wish to retain such membership but desire to participate in the life and mission of this congregation. These individuals have all the privileges and duties of membership except voting rights or other rights and privileges

The [congregation][Congregation Council] shall elect its officers and they shall be the officers of this congregation. The officers shall be elected by written ballot and shall serve for one year or until their successors are elected. Their terms shall begin at the close of the annual meeting at which they are elected.

The officers shall be elected by the [congregation] [Congregation Council] by written ballot and shall serve for one year. The term shall begin on ____(month and day) and end on ____(month and day).

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

*PREAMBLE

We, baptized members of the Church of Christ, responding in faith to the call of the Holy Spirit through the Gospel, desiring to unite together to preach the Word, administer the sacraments, and carry out God's mission, do hereby adopt this constitution and solemnly pledge ourselves to be governed by its provisions. In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Chapter 1.

NAME AND INCORPORATION

- C1.01. The name of the congregation shall be St. Thomas Evangelical Lutheran Church of Brick Township.
- C1.02. For the purpose of this constitution and the accompanying bylaws, the congregation of St. Thomas Evangelical Lutheran Church of Brick Township is hereinafter designated as "this congregation."
- C1.11. This congregation shall be incorporated under the laws of the State of New Jersey.
- C1.12. The seal of this congregation presents a Cross surrounded by rays around which is the legend "The St. Thomas Ey. Lutheran Church, Brick Town, N.J. Organized Feb. 23, 1961".

Chapter 2.

CONFESSION OF FAITH

- *C2.01. This congregation confesses the Triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
- *C2.02. This congregation confesses Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior and the Gospel as the

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Bylaws and Continuing Resolutions

One Unified Document: Constitution, Bylaws, (Continuing Resolutions)

- Bylaws give further specification and detail in how the congregation will enact the constitution/function as an institution in the local context
- Bylaws are inserted after their relevant Constitutional Provision
- Bylaws are codified using the relevant Constitutional Provision codification then adding two-digit sequential numerals followed by a dot.

i.e. C10.01. is the Constitutional provisions for an Annual Meeting of the Congregation

A related Bylaw might be: This congregation shall hold it's annual meeting of the congregation on a Sunday in the month of January.

The Bylaw would codified as: C10.01.01.

C10.01.

This congregation shall have at least one regular meeting per year. The regular meeting(s) of the congregation shall be held at the time(s) specified in the bylaws. Consistent with the laws of the State of ______, the bylaws shall designate one regular meeting per year as the annual meeting of this congregation.

Bylaws and Continuing Resolutions

One Unified Document: Constitution, Bylaws, (Continuing Resolutions)

- Continuing Resolutions are meant to offer further definition and detail for function as an institution
- Continuing Resolutions are meant to be frequently reviewed, revised, and adopted/removed
- Continuing Resolutions are placed after their relevant Constitutional Provision and/or Bylaw
- Continuing Resolutions are codified using the relevant Constitutional Provision or Bylaw using alphabetical listing followed by the two-digit year the Continuing Resolution was adopted, such as C10.01.A25 or C10.01.01.A25
